#### HOW WELL DO YOU KNOW GOD?



Most of us think that we know God. And in truth, all of us know Him at one level or another. We know Him intellectually. That is, we know that He created the universe. We know He is eternal. That is, we all have a sense that we will be dead and gone before the sun burns out and the earth turns to cinders. Yes, all of us know something about God, but how well do we know Him?"

The scriptures tell us that David was a man after God's own heart (Acts 13:22); that Abraham was "the friend of God", and that Enoch walked with God. Enoch

pleased God so well that God literally took him out of the earth into heaven so they could continue their fellowship. I would say that Enoch knew God pretty well. But the description of the relationship these other men had with God implies that we all have the chance to know God more intimately.

How well do you know God? Would you say He's your best friend? Do you know His favorite color? If you had to introduce Him as guest of honor at a program, how would you introduce Him? What would you say about Him that's funny?

Is there somebody you know better than God? How much time do you spend with Him? How often do you talk to Him? Again, all these questions have implications for our prayer life. Most of us think we pray. And according to our understanding of prayer, we probably are praying as best we know. However, it is possible to know Him better. Prayer is the key to knowing Him better. We must learn to break through our soul's resistance to prayer by simply praying more, becoming more comfortable in praying to Him. We want to get ourselves to the point where talking to Him is our favorite thing to do. Out of this comes sensitivity to His will and a desire to do His will.
